**News Release - July 28th, 2015
 Harper Government invests \$950,000 in Northern Saskatchewan Fishing Industry**

The Northern Village of Ile a la Crosse will construct a Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA) certified fish packing and processing facility thanks to a \$950,000 investment from the Government of Canada announced today by Rob Clarke, Member of Parliament for Desnethé-Missinippi-Churchill River, on behalf of the Honourable Michelle Rempel, Minister of State for Western Economic Diversification.

According to the Freshwater Marketing Corporation (FFMC), there is a growing consumer demand for fresh wild-caught fish nationally and internationally. The Ile a la Crosse facility currently takes fresh caught fish from local fishers and sends them to the FFMC to process and distribute. This investment in a new federally registered facility will expand the existing fishing industry in Northwest Saskatchewan by introducing new value-added products, such as Northern Pike Roe and deboned Northern Pike Fillets, which will be exported to new international markets.

Wildfire / Smoke Evacuation Post-Report

Thank You

I would first like to start by thanking those individuals and families who had come to volunteer their time and efforts at the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) while the planning and executing of the emergency plan to evacuate priority residents of our community took place. Without you this would have made our efforts much more difficult and our Emergency Committee would definitely have more gray hairs than we already do! Our community never fails to rise up to the task when faced with adversity and this is yet another example of how much we truly care for each other's well being.

Emergency Committee

This is also a good opportunity to remind residents that we are looking for individuals to sit on the emergency planning committee, if you are interested in becoming part of this group please contact myself by calling or texting (306) 288—7123. We would like to arrange for training sessions from the Provincial Emergency Management department on creation of emergency plans for various scenarios.

Post-Evacuation Tips

The Wildfire season is still not quite over and we would like to remind residents to be aware of precautionary tips for air quality/smoke that were posted during the declaration. We would also like to remind residents that during a time of emergency, please address concerns and questions to the Emergency Committee and try to avoid taking too much information from social media. For every small amount of fact on social media there are mountains of misinformation as well. The Emergency Committee keeps in constant communication with the Provincial Emergency Coordinators and try at all lengths to get correct information first before releasing it to the public.

Food Boxes

Our community was blessed with some food boxes that were donated by Kitsaki Management Ltd and the Potash Corp. Our first shipment saw 50 boxes delivered that were assigned to those priority evacuees that registered with our EOC. Since then we've had many more boxes delivered to our community and we will be working on assigning those in the next few days, so do not be surprised if we call you or show up on your door steps with a Food Box. We would like to thank Kitsaki and Potash Corp for their generous donation to assisting those families that were displaced from the evacuation order.

In closing, I would like to thank everyone who also assisted in sharing the information with their neighbors especially for those who stayed behind. On behalf of Mayor & Council and the Emergency Committee, we appreciate everything our community does to look out for one another.
