Northern Lights School Division #113 Area # 3 Representative - November 2015 Report

It has been a while since my last report for Northern Lights School Division Area # 3 which includes Beauval, Patuanak, Cole & Jans Bay. In fact it has been long enough to have gone through a couple of Directors. Our new Director of Education started work October 1, 2014; he has been familiarizing himself with staffs and visiting all communities under our jurisdiction. Dr. Ken Ladouceur holds a Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) from the University of Regina and a Master of Education (MEd) from the University of Saskatchewan. His experiences include several teaching assignments in Saskatchewan, principal-ships in Saskatchewan and Alberta, Superintendent of Education positions in Colorado and Michigan, and ten years as a Director of Education in Saskatchewan. As our new Director he has been making time to travel to visit all communities and the many schools across the north. When you think about it Northern Lights School division region is a massive geographical area, it covers the top half of our province, it makes it that much more challenging for division staff to visit each school and yet be effective in performing their duties, that means being a road warrior and being away from home with many late nights travelling.

We have recently learned of one of our Superintendents having to take time off to deal with personal challenges, we wish her every success in overcoming these challenges and wish her a speedy return. Recruitment to fill her position on a temporary basis was successful, we are happy to report that we have hired a local northern aboriginal person that has or exceeds all the necessary qualifications required for the position. I would like to take this time to publically extend my congratulations and best wishes for success with this opportunity that ends in June 2015. He has plenty of time to prove himself with the challenge of his new duties. I have every confidence in his ability, with the enthusiasm he expressed during the interview along with the support from his colleagues he will do well.

I no longer sit on the NORTEP Board by choice, I feel

I have done enough on that Board, with the many changes that have been attained and implemented over the past 4 years we are now in full accord with expectations from Ministry. A policy and procedures manual is now in place and staffs now have formal procedures to follow in their day to day activity.

After a 2 year absence from the Saskatchewan School Boards Association (SSBA) executive I am now back on for a 2 year term. I initially stepped down due to work commitments I couldn't carry on and be effective, now that I'm retired from formal work I have plenty of time to commit so that I can be an effective contributing executive member. At SSBA we are progressing into initiatives that will have a positive impact on the public education system into the future. We have a strategic plan with specific targets for the year 2025. This plan is on the SSBA website if you are interested in looking at the goals that we have set. The goals are consistent with the province's goals.

NLSD recently took the opportunity to present a resolution at the SSBA Annual General Meeting on the issue of "Poverty". As a division we feel the fundamental problem of why Aboriginal students are behind academically with the rest of the province has a lot to do with poverty and attendance, these two are synonymous and is the main cause of poor academic performance. If students are not in the classroom they are not learning. Poverty impacts the student's physical & mental health. If their basic needs are not met they won't be able to fully function in school let alone make it to school. In my capacity as executive member I am committed to bringing this issue to the forefront so that the provincial government can align themselves to address this impediment. We need to have collaborative efforts from relevant ministries and school boards to eradicate Poverty in our province. Identifying and defining poverty will be a good place to start. All children have the ability to perform at a higher level if their basic needs are met and they are healthy. Saskatchewan is one of the richest provinces in our country Canada, with many

renewable and non-renewable resources yet Northern Saskatchewan is considered one of the poorest regions in Canada according to a report from The Conference Board of Canada.

Professional staffs throughout the province working in our public schools have the opportunity to turn things around on behalf of all students but specifically for Aboriginal students that have been marginalized for far too long. Students that come from low income families or are living below the poverty line are considered most at risk when it comes to attaining a formal education. Professional staffs in publically funded schools need to recognize this and need to make adjustments in their approach in teaching these students. They need to show all students, no matter where they come from or their circumstance that they care about their wellbeing and their success in school. It is no secret that students will respond to their teacher if the teacher shows respect and compassion, and if they show a genuine concern for their learning. There is an adage (author unknown), that goes something like this, "Students don't care what their teacher knows, they care that their teacher knows them". Take care of the students feelings and they will take care of you. Parents play the most critical role in making sure their child is attending school and succeeding academically. For those parents that struggle with their child there are in-house supports in place at all schools to assist parents, I encourage parents to use the services.

Aboriginal issues will also be at the forefront of the agenda of SSBA. I recently had the opportunity to listen to the Premier of our province speak at a public function; he has made it a point to address the issue of low graduation rates among Aboriginal students. The province has set specific targets for graduation rates with strategic goals on how to improve graduation rates by the year 2020. He also made a

commitment to improve reading levels to align to grade levels. Currently the focus is Grades K- 3. The Ministry have started "Saskatchewan Reads Program" to help school divisions to build upon their own initiatives toward improving student reading levels, this is identified in "Saskatchewan Plan for Growth" and the "Education Sector Strategic Plan". The strategy is showing some promising results since its inception. Studies show that if children are able to read to grade level they will not struggle as much in all subject areas. Boards across the province have a pivotal role to play in providing the opportunity to students to be successful no matter what their socio-economic circumstance or status.

I encourage the public to get in touch with me if there is anything that you feel I should be addressing or bringing forward in the education sector or in any sector that you feel has an impact in educating children. Just a reminder, if the issue is a local issue that has to do with the local school I encourage you to take it to your local SCC (School Community Council), SCC's play a very important role in the day to day operation of the local school. The issue of improving graduation outcomes for all students is everyone's concern as it impacts us all in the long run; if students are not successful and are not completing high school and moving on to post-secondary and getting a job to become contributing members of society, then we have failed. As professional staff in schools, parents and those that advocate learning let's work together to ensure our students have the opportunity to be successful.
