

Brain Talk - April 2017

The Trail to ATV Safety - Ride Safe, Ride Smart! In 2014, there were 37 collisions involving snowmobiles and off-highway vehicles on public roads. ATV injuries are on the rise. Data from CIHI (Canadian Institute for Health Information) shows that there was a 31% increase of ATV injuries in the last decade.

Due to the increased speeds of the machines, injuries are serious ranging from fractures and broken bones to spinal cord and brain injuries. Safety tips for riders:

- 1. Wear an approved helmet.
- 2. Wear protective eyewear.

3. Get Trained.

4. Ride with a buddy.

5. Do not carry passengers if your ATV is not built for it.

- 6. Drive at safe speeds.
- 7. Stop at all crossing to ensure it is safe.
- 8. Respect wildlife/Respect the environment.
- 9. Drinking/drugs & riding don't mix

Riding ATV's in public places

- Drivers must be 16 years old
- Drivers must have a valid driver's license
- Youth between 12-15 can operate an ATV in public areas IF they have passed an approved training course and are supervised by someone who has had their license for more then 1 year.

CAA Saskatchewan Worst Roads Campaign

The 2017 CAA Saskatchewan Worst Roads campaign is April 3 to 28. The worst roads travelled on by Saskatchewan drivers can be identified. New to this year's campaign is the invitation to cyclists and pedestrians to voice their concerns and nominate roads they think are in most need of improvement or repair. These worst roads might have potholes or crumbling pavement, poor road signs, lack of cycling or walking infrastructure, or traffic congestion.
