Metis Nation – Saskatchewan Metis Nation Legislative Assembly Report

I recently had opportunity to attend a Metis Nation Legislative Assembly (MNLA) held in Saskatoon this past weekend, I was there representing Sipisishk Metis Local #37 as President. This is my first MNLA since becoming President of our Local. I am preparing this report to communicate information on the proceedings to our local membership. Delegates from across the province were in attendance. Delegates are Presidents of each Metis Local and along with Regional Directors that makes up the Metis Nation Legislative Assembly.

The assembly started off in the morning with a hot breakfast, after breakfast the Provincial Metis Council, Elders, Youth and three flag bearers were marched in with fiddle music and a Metis jigger/dancer leading the way. You can see the pride in each individual in attendance as the dancer approached with marchers following close behind. An Elder started off the meeting with an opening prayer followed by formal speakers. Vice-President Gerald Morin of Metis Nation - Saskatchewan opened up the formal part of the meeting with a message of encouragement and expressing the importance for MN-S to get their house in order. He reported that the future has never looked brighter and promising for Metis of Canada. We have never had the recognition that we now have. This is a result of many years of work from those that preceded us they helped pave the way. We now have clarification as to what level of government is responsible for Metis across western Canada. The next speaker was President David Chartrand of the Manitoba Metis Federation. He reports that MMF has been making strides with procuring settlement to historical claims they had registered through the courts against Major Corporation. The willingness on the part of federal government has been good thus far; they have been working with MMF to correct historical wrongs. I was extremely impressed with the things that MMF has been able to accomplish over the years this was through good solid leadership. MMF is

quickly paving the way for the rest of Metis across Canada. It is critical that MN-S get moving once the elections are done.

The biggest task ahead for Metis in Saskatchewan at this time is completing a successful election, once the executive is in place we need to roll up our sleeves and work at getting our governance & financial house in order. I feel positive that we will get this done promptly, it is critical that we do this right as our future as a governing body hangs in a balance. This includes our Metis Locals; they need to get organized to make a solid foundation in order to gain confidence from their membership.

Through a federal government agreement with MN-S, Ernst & Young were hired by the MN-S to run the provincial affairs this was set up due to the lack of MNLA over the past few years. EY presented a synopsis of our financial situation and it is not flattering, but I feel optimistic that we can get out of it through negotiations. This presentation took a large part of the day.

As part of the agreement Ernst & Young were given the responsibility of retaining and protecting the Metis registry that was started a few years ago, the private/confidential information is being housed in a safe place, no activity was reported in this area. This activity will commence after elections are complete and the Provincial Metis Council (PMC) is in place with the necessary resources and capacity to do the complex work needed to get back on track. There will be a transition period of approximately two months with EY turning over information to the new PMC and MNLA.

It is obvious that most of our future activity pivots on the election that is scheduled for May 27, 2017. Once this is complete the Provincial Metis Council, with your help as members can begin working on rebuilding our Metis Nation-Saskatchewan so we can take our place in governance in this country and province. "The Métis Nation and People are a distinct SOCIETY within the Aboriginal Peoples of Canada.

The Métis are distinct from the Indians and Inuit and are the descendants of the historic Métis who evolved in what is now Western Canada and part of the northern United States as a people with a common political will and consciousness". This paragraph was taken from our Metis constitution.

I'm sure this report/update raises many questions for my fellow Metis citizens, as your Metis Local we too have many questions that

require answers hopefully they will be answered once our leadership is in place at the provincial level.

If you have any questions pertaining to this report or the upcoming Metis elections please do not hesitate to get in touch, I may not have the answers but I will commit to look for answers on your behalf.
